NEBRASKA

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, Nebraska has added over **78,600 new jobs** and unleashed nearly **\$497.8 million** in private sector investment in the state. The state has seen a significant decrease in unemployment, and millions of people in Nebraska stand to benefit from the President's actions to lower health care, energy, and education costs.

The Biden-Harris Administration's Investing in America agenda has unleashed \$497.8 million in private sector manufacturing and clean energy investments, including:

- ★ Novozymes committed to building a \$316 million investment in Blair, Nebraska to produce innovative plant-based protein products.
- ★ Sustainable Beef LLC recently broke ground at a \$325 million beef processing facility in North Platte. Once operational, the plant is projected to create 875 jobs.
- ★ 3M is investing \$67 million to expand its capabilities to manufacture respiratory and hearing protection products in Nebraska, creating 50 new jobs.

The Biden-Harris Administration has made historic investments to improve Nebraska's infrastructure and build a clean energy economy, including:

- ★ Lincoln Multimodal Transit Center: The U.S. Department of Transportation awarded \$23.6 million to construct the Lincoln Multimodal Transit Center. The new sustainable transit center will include bus bays, protected passenger boarding, covered walkways, and more, all of which will improve the safety and security of passengers and pedestrians.
- **★** Eppley Airfield Enhancements: The Eppley Airfield in Omaha was awarded \$30 million for a new terminal drop-off area and full canopy to reduce air pollution and improve access for passengers with disabilities.
- ★ <u>Missouri River Basin Levee Repairs</u>: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers awarded **\$67 million** for levee repairs following the Missouri River Basin flooding.
- ★ McCool Junction Clean School Buses: The McCool Junction Public School District was awarded over \$395,000 in funding to replace existing diesel school buses with a fleet of new electric ones.
- ★ Reducing Wildfire Risk in North-Central Nebraska: The Department of Agriculture's Forest Service has awarded \$182,866 to the Nature Conservancy to reduce hazardous fuels and restore fire adapted ecosystems at the 56,000-acre Niobrara Valley Preserve (NVP). This would reduce the severity and

impacts of wildfire on surrounding communities. This project includes six target sites totaling approximately 435 acres.

- ★ Omaha Tribe of Nebraska Fiber-Based Grant: The Department of Commerce awarded approximately \$36 million to Omaha Tribe of Nebraska and its 100% Tribally owned subsidiary, Quick Current, to deploy a fiber-based network to cover currently unserved and underserved Tribal and adjacent rural areas in eastern Nebraska and western Iowa. The project will provide infrastructure and services to the surrounding areas of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska and Iowa and the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska and Iowa.
- ★ Cornhusker Railroad Regional Connectivity Project: The Department of Transportation has awarded \$15 million to Cathcart Rail for rail infrastructure and safety improvements in Nebraska through the Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) program. The proposed project involves final design and construction activities for track-related improvements, upgrades to certain grade crossings, and expansion of the railcar repair facility. The project will help modernize the Cornhusker Railroad, resulting in safer and more efficient operations, including improved interchanging of train with two Class I railroads.
- ★ Climate-Smart and Precision Agriculture: The Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy will receive \$307 million to fund measures to increase the adoption of climate-smart and precision agriculture and reduce agricultural waste from livestock. The selected application will also fund projects to improve energy efficiency in commercial and industrial facilities and low-income households as well as deploy solar and electrify irrigation wells.
- ★ <u>Solar Energy</u>: The Center for Rural Affairs will receive \$62 million in funding to launch the first state-wide program to ensure low-income and disadvantaged households in the state have equitable access to solar power.
