RHODE ISLAND

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, Rhode Island has added over **45,000 new jobs** and unleashed nearly **\$856.7 million** in private sector investment in the state. The state has seen a significant decrease in unemployment, and millions of people in Rhode Island stand to benefit from the President's actions to lower health care, energy, and education costs.

- ★ RI Energy plans to invest \$529 million to modernize Rhode Island's electric grid, increase resilience, and drive the transition to a clean energy economy.

The Biden-Harris Administration has made historic investments to improve Rhode Island's infrastructure and build a clean energy economy, including:

- ★ Climate Friendly Transportation: The U.S. Department of Transportation provided \$22.3 million to the Rhode Island Public Transit Authority to fund charging infrastructure, facility upgrades, and the purchase of 25 electric buses.
- Newport Pell Bridge Rehabilitation: U.S. Department of Transportation awarded \$82.5 million to the Rhode Island Turnpike and Bridge Authority to rehabilitate the Newport Pell Bridge, a 4-lane suspension bridge over Narragansett Bay.
- ★ Deep Pond and School House Pond Watershed Resilliency Enhancements: The Department of Agriculture awarded \$14 million help address erosion control, water quality, and habitat improvements within the Deep Pond and School House Pond watershed in and around Charlestown.
- ★ Smart Grid Investments: The Department of Energy awarded \$50 million to Rhode Island Energy to deploy smart grid investments in service of clean energy. The project will improve the grid's service and demonstrate how a smart grid can enable smart decarbonization at scale safely, reliably, and affordably.
- ★ Right-sizing Route 37: Improving Community Connectivity: The Department of Transportation awarded \$25 million to the Rhode Island Department of Transportation to fund multimodal improvements on RI Route 37. The project improves connections to transit, implements transit signal priority, and will better position the area to support future light rail and/or bus transit, increasing affordable transportation choices.
- What Cheer Flower Farm: The Environmental Protection Agency awarded
 \$500,000 to What Cheer Flower Farm or a Brownfields Cleanup Grant. Grant funds will be used to clean up What Cheer Flower Farm. The site is

contaminated with metals, chlorinated volatile organic compounds, petroleum, and inorganic contaminants. The funding will help accelerate clean-up efforts of contaminated sites, spur economic redevelopment, and build safer, more resilient communities for the next generation.

- ★ I-95 15: Infrastructure for Tomorrow's Economy Project: The Rhode Island Department of Transportation will receive \$251 million for the I-95 15: Infrastructure for Tomorrow's Economy Project in Providence, Rhode Island, to improve the condition of 15 bridges critical to the local economy. The project will support the safe movement of goods and travel of residents, connecting them to key neighborhoods throughout the city of Providence.
- ★ Washington Bridge Replacement: The Department of Transportation awarded nearly \$221 million to the Rhode Island Department of Transportation to replace the Washington Bridge and restore the bridge to its full capacity since the emergency closure of the westbound lanes in December of 2023.
- ★ Solar Energy: The Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources will receive \$49 million in funding for the launch and expansion of a comprehensive suite of seven financial assistance programs and twelve project deployment technical assistance initiatives, which are designed to equitably address barriers to solar adoption in Rhode Island's low-income and disadvantaged communities.
- New England Heat Pump Accelerator Project: The Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources will help implement the \$450 million New England Heat Pump Accelerator project, which will rapidly accelerate the adoption of coldclimate air-source heat pumps, heat pump water heaters, and ground source heat pumps in more than 500,000 single-family and multifamily residential buildings.
